• Fulbright-Nehru Specialist Program - Institutional Award - Application Deadline: May 15, 2024

The Fulbright Specialist program provides an opportunity to Indian institutions of higher learning to invite U.S. scholars and professionals to their campus for a period of 2-6 weeks, to draw on the expertise of U.S. scholars and professionals and develop linkages with American institutions.

USIEF pays for the international airfare and honorarium to the Specialist. The host institution in India is responsible for the cost of housing, meals, and any necessary, program-related, incountry transportation.

Eligible Institutions: Host institutions should be involved in university-level teaching or training, the expansion of partnerships between universities and specialized institutions, and the promotion of international and cross-institutional cooperation. Institutions eligible to request a Fulbright Specialist include:

- Institutions/organizations of higher education approved and listed on the website of the Ministry of Education, Government of India, including institutions accredited by AICTE, UGC and other Apex Level Bodies of the Ministry (https://www.education.gov.in/en/apex-level-bodies)
- Medical institutions accredited by the Medical Council of India (MCI)
